## 1.0 ORGANIZATIONAL BACKGROUND

*Brief description of the applicant, key objectives, activities and achievements (Maximum 200 words)*

Sawa Sudan for Development and Humanitarian Aid Organization (SSDHA) is non-governmental organization, non-profitable, established in 2008 in Khartoum as federal organization, then moved to other states; in Darfour, Kordofan and Blue Nile states. We conduct community empowerment in different aspects; environment and natural resources conservation and sustainable development, peace, and health among different communities in Sudan.

## 2.0 SUB-PROJECT SUMMARY

*Brief overview of the applicant's sub-project (Goal, Objectives and Results) (Maximum 500 Words)*

The Sudan Round Tree initiative for Capacity Building in North and South Kordofan for low carbon emissions is aimed at strengthening the capacity of sub-national stakeholders at targeted villages focusing on forest dependent Indigenous Peoples (IPs), Indigenous Peoples organizations (IPOs), community based organizations, in order to involve and contribute in the development of REDD+ programs in Sudan. The project will be financed by grant from the FCPF – World Bank through MPIDO and to be implemented in 9 months. The project will seek to consolidate the relation between different stakeholders at different levels to accelerate the understanding of REDD+ concept through developing, creative, preparation, and implementation of direct and indirect program activities for IP communities, in the two targeted states. The specific objectives of the project focus are three fold; one, strengthening IP community's capacity and building knowledge on REDD+ and climate change; second, enhancing communication, awareness and creation of dialogue among the stakeholders and the IP community and thirdly, sharing knowledge and dissemination of relevant REDD+ information in two local languages.

The project aims to achieve these results and outcomes at various levels; at sub national level capacity building activities on climate change and REDD+ undertaken locally in two states and which will result in strengthened capacities of communities and effective engagement of IPs with government and others stakeholders. Opened dialogue and discourse on different themes related to livelihood with connection to REDD+ and climate change among the communities and through the media – is expected to result in increased participation and positive response by the communities. Generation of local knowledge products will be developed on issues related to REDD+ and disseminated and sharing knowledge activities with IPs, government's institutes, academic and other stakeholders.

## 3.0 PROBLEM ANALYSIS AND STATEMENT

*Explain the problem the sub-project intends to address and the anticipated changes to the broader community (Maximum 500 words)*

Sawa Sudan (SSDHA) learned from Phase 1 of the project that the three selected areas in North and South Kordofan region is characterized by increasing degradation of ecological environment and natural resources resulting to widespread food insecurity and poverty. As a consequence, some 35% of the population is food insecure and experience acute hunger during the five months of the food gap from June to November each year exacerbating the problems of malnutrition, increasing incidences of diseases, poor health and high infant mortality specifically in north Kordofan. The project will develop communities' knowledge on the impact of deforestation and degradation and how REDD+ is the real opportunity to improve their forest and their livelihood.

Main indicators of these livelihood problems include deterioration of water sources, removal and destruction of forests, deterioration of range and pastures, soil erosion, loss of biodiversity and conversion of vast tracts of land that were previously agricultural and pastoral into desert or desert-like conditions. The creeping process of desertification remains a major source of poverty. The problem is adversely affecting the women, children, returnees, IDPs and migrants who are highly vulnerable to food insecurity and poverty and as well as affecting the forest cover and the decreasing resilience to drought. Land degradation, together with climate change, has also brought about enormous challenges to customary land tenure regimes while contributed to the erosion of relations between social groups. Drought and climate change since 1985 in North Kordofan, coupled with the inherent weakness and fragility of livelihood strategies, has affected the life of the people on an unprecedented scale. Um Ruwaba is highly vulnerable to the impacts of climate change such as stresses of drought and floods due to its particular location. This has led to severe degradation of the gum Arabic (Acacia Senegal) trees, a species traditionally known for its adaptation to the regional ecology, contribution to soil fertility, economic profitability through the sale of gum Arabic (a primary cash crop in the region), and supply of fodder for livestock. This change resulted in desertification and mass movement of population from the area which has had devastating results on the livelihoods of the population. The South Kordofan state is less affected and vulnerable to drought condition, its wetter than it's the counterpart North Kordofan, the adverse impacts of climate may be experienced in directly via force migrations and activity of the army operation in the area which led to change in the vegetation covered.

The project in improving the IP community's capacity on REDD+ will improve their resilience to the immediate adverse effects, as well as increase their active participation in national REDD+ project and processes for the eventual long term mitigation of the situation. The project will also specifically document local knowledge as well as produce knowledge products informed by the opinion of the IP community seeking to influence decision and other REDD+ policies at different levels

**Goal of the Project:** To build the autonomous capacity of IPs in three localities in North and South Kordofan targeted forest dependent IPs living in and around the forests in order to strengthen their awareness and participation in REDD+ process at local level and national level to take action for green future.

- 1- To build knowledge and strengthen capacity of IPs to understanding REDD+, deforestation, forest degradation and climate change issues – at the sub-national level.
- 2- To Raise awareness of the Local Indigenous Communities and multi-stakeholders to undertake communication activities within the framework of REDD+ Program and climate change- at the sub national level
- 3- Generate and document knowledge products, sharing information and communication on REDD+ in 2 local languages

Targeted 80% women and 20% youth and men

**Activity 1:** Conduct three training workshops each one 5 days on REDD+ process and climate change as follow:

- 1- AL Rahad locality at North Kordofan.
- 2- UmRowab locality at North Kordofan.
- 3- Abujebiha locality at South Kordofan.

To addressing the following topics:

Conduct three training workshops each 5 days on REDD+ process and climate change in the targeted project areas ( AL Rahad and UmRowab Localities at North Kordofan and Abujebiha locality at South Kordofan): capacity building activities is to helps and support the priorities of IPs at localities and villages with regarding REDD+ and this includes: understanding climate change and its impacts, what is REDD+ and potential benefit gain and its risk, why need to fully participate on REDD+, to know their right to decide either accept or reject to be with REDD+ activities (Free, prior and informed consent). Also how to be effective in sustainable management of the forest to reduce degradation and deforestation and then reduce emissions, how to participate in monitoring of forests this will be identified through explain the Role of the women in forest protection and preservation – Role of the NGOs, CBOs and media in REDD+ process and climate change.

**Objectives 2: To Raise awareness of the Local Indigenous Community and multi-stakeholders undertake communication activities within the framework of REDD+ Program and climate change- at the sub national /state level**

**Activity 1:** Establish /Formulation REDD+ forums of indigenous persons at sub national level in three localities at North and South Kordofan to open forest dialogue and discussion about fostering REDD+ process and climate change (themes: alternative energy from traditional indigenous knowledge, gender equality in REDD+, simple techniques of water harvesting in rural areas and the role of media in REDD+ and conflicts and climate change).

**Activity 2:** Produce Indigenous Forum reports to inform and influence decisions and policy.

**Objectives 3 -Generate knowledge products, sharing information and communication on REDD+ in 2 local languages**

**Activity 1:** Formulation Meeting at federal level with indigenous local authorities and related institutions, Amir, Shikh and Uomda and leaders of women led associations and REED+ network to sharing knowledge products and information, learning and experiences in all issues related to the REDD+ and climate change concept with a road map for future interventions.

**Activity 2:** Conduct Stakeholders analysis (analysis study on type of stakeholders who have power to impacts on an organization and on the project in the project areas). The study will identify the opportunities at the public sector and private sector to ally with them to achieve the REDD+ goals and also how to neutralize and win antagonists.

**Activity 3:** conduct Study on Indigenous land management and role of customary laws for forest management.

**Activity 4:** conduct study on Conflict and Climate Change (Military conflicts as driver to deforestation)

**Activity 5:** conduct study on Gender under climate change; stresses on gaps and road map in North and South Kordofan.

The study will highlight the great burden on women such as bringing water from distant area and fire wood for cooking and livelihood, deterioration of the traditional agriculture, loss of the herds.

**Activity 6:** Local Radio (community radio for dissemination of message and creating discourse between IPs and Decision makers and authorities

**Activity 7:** Out lines for REDD+ manual.

SAWA Sudan will also leverage its funding with those of other institutions including NGOs and government departments

The formed indigenous persons’ forums on various REDD+ and climate change areas shall be sustained through proposition to other Climate change stakeholders (like FAO) for continued support.
